\$40. 100 meals for people on the streets in South America. The global economy is doing better than ever, and we still have millions of people living in slums. What's our problem? \$40 buys you 100 meals for extremely poor people in Vino Nuevo, Uruguay.

\$5. A food package for underprivileged pensioners in Uruguay. The golden years aren't so golden for these government-housing pensioners in Uruguay. But the Ahola family will brighten up the lives of some of them with a package of edible staples and goodies. Buy enough for two couples for \$10.

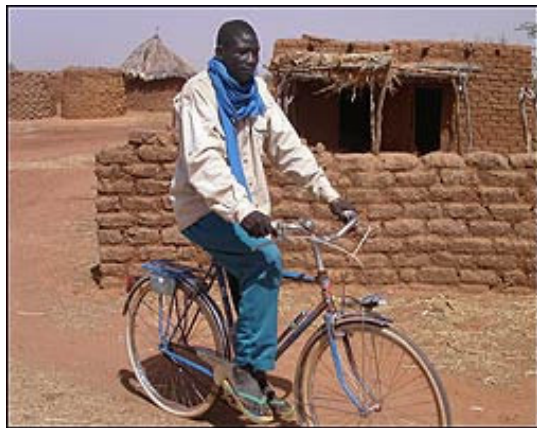
\$40. One month of life skills training for boys coming off drugs. When we talk about street kids in Toronto and most Western cities, we usually mean young adults. But in most Third World nations, street kids are street *kids*. Four years old, six years old, 10, 12... Many of them orphans, they don't know how to cope. Some of the ones that survive turn to drugs, crippling their lives even further. The Ahola family helps some of these boys by taking them off the street and teaching them what they need to survive in a healthier way. Help one boy get back on his feet with a month's worth of life skills training for \$40.

\$100. A bike for an evangelist in Zambia.

One of my parents' ministries in Zambia is helping people to study the Bible through Emmaus Bible correspondence courses. These make their way into the remotest villages of the Luapula province not through the mail system, but through people - evangelists who do what it takes to get the courses there and back. Most of these evangelists work part-time in their own gardens and fields to support themselves and have very little money. So to help them with all their traveling, evangelists who distribute a certain number of Bible courses qualify to receive a free bicycle. Would you like to buy this World-Changer for \$100?



\$10. Ten bike tires for seed-sowers in Zambia.

This follows from the previous World-Changer. Guess what happens when you ride a bike through the bush for hours and hours and hours? Well, the tires eventually wear out. Buy 10 replacement World-Changer tires for evangelists in Zambia for \$10.

\$20. 1,000 AIDS Tracts.

40 million people are infected with HIV/AIDS, and 20 million have died from it. Thankfully, AIDS is starting to get some of the exposure and funding it deserves. But how are we fighting it? While some scoff at the idea of fighting AIDS through the encouragement of marital faithfulness and abstinence, others employ this strategy because they believe it is the right way and because they have seen it work (eg, the nation of Uganda). 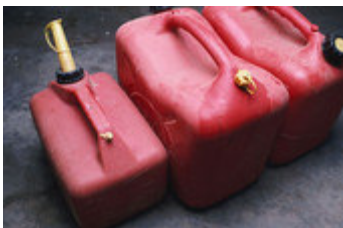


\$15. 50 cold drinks for 50 streetgirls.

Why cold drinks? Because this is what is served to these 50 girls who make their living on the streets when they come to Mansa Mission every week. They come because they know they are loved unconditionally here, and because they hope they can escape this life of prostitution. They receive ministry from the Word of God, and learn new skills--like sewing and crocheting--that could help them begin anew.

\$50. A sewing machine for local Zambian women to sew clothes for widows and orphans.

There is a group of women in Mansa, Zambia called the "Dorcas group." There are just a handful of them, but they have decided to take [James 1:27](#) literally by giving their time to sewing clothes for local widows and orphans. This group is in need of more sewing machines, so if you would like to buy one, give someone this \$50 World-Changer as a gift this Christmas.



\$25. 20 litres of fuel for a Christian bookvan in the Muslim World.

In a country that is 99% Muslim, these young men risk their lives every time they step into their bookvan loaded with Bibles and Christian literature and drive into their city of 15 million people. And although they've been threatened countless times, they keep doing it; and people keep taking their tracts and buying the books and Bibles they display from their "bookstore on wheels." Be part of the action through \$25-worth of fuel for this bookvan for God.

\$25. Five Bibles for the Muslim World.

"How many Bibles do you have? Two, three, four, five, six...?", asks Brother Andrew of Open Doors ministries. "Why should I have two Bibles when some people don't even have one?" A challenging question, especially when you consider that millions of people haven't even heard the Gospel. In fact, many have not heard the name Jesus. So here is one of my favourite World-Changers: distributed through the Jalals' bookvan, five Bibles for the Muslim world - \$25 that *will* change someone's world.
